At the Cambon farm, on the banks of the Gardon in Mialet (Gard, 30). A typical Cévennes farm with 14 ha of terraces and woodland, springs, pools and a stone building of over 300 m<sup>2</sup>.

Test concrete solutions to better face the climate, economic and social crises.

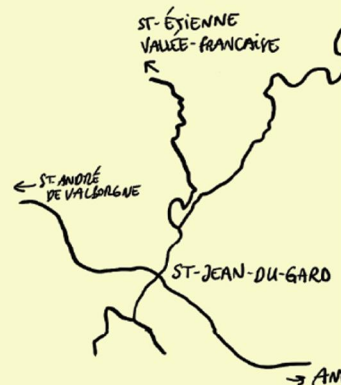
## SUSTAIN
